Spring Plant Care

Don't Pick Up Hitchhikers

Spring is a busy season for shows and sales and that means our collections become much more dynamic. New plants move in, old plants move out, and our prized specimens will be on the road rubbing elbows with plants from out of town.

All that movement increases exposure to pests. That means we need to be extra careful to follow good isolation and treatment practices. Not just for our own collections- but for our fellow orchid enthusiasts.

Therefore, it is vital to perform *thorough* visual inspections before plants leave your

collection and after they return.

Isolate new or returning plants from the rest of your collection for several days and observe them for any sign of infestation. Plants should be treated immediately when pests are discovered so make sure you have appropriate products on hand and ready to use.

With some simple precautions and a keen eye you can keep your and your fellow orchidists' collections protected.

Speed is key!

Insect pests can rapidly increase their numbers. When you see bugs- don't hesitate!

Mealybugs - One generation develops every one to three months depending on temperature.

Brown Soft Scale -It takes about 60 days to complete a generation

You Can Grow Orchids!

April 13th, Canoyer Garden Center – Grimes

This was our first event of a kind, in addition to the annual sales day at Reiman Garden in February. With this event, we particularly wanted to focus on the educational component, so that lowans who may be considering orchids as difficult plants to keep alive would not be afraid of growing them. Canoyer Garden Center-Grimes graciously offered us space free-of-charge during their Spring Open House weekend.

The event included three main components: educational (orchid culture, Q&A, free re-potting), small display to showcase different orchid genera, and orchid sale.

We particularly wanted to expand the sale beyond Phalaenopsis to offer additional types of orchids. Cattleyas, zygopetalums, and a few Aussie dendrobiums were brought from Sunset Valley Orchids, and oncidium alliance, miltoniopsis, and several dendrobium plants were obtained from Kalapana Tropicals. The sale generated a revenue of over \$500, more than a dozen of orchids was repotted, numerous questions answered, and the lovely orchid display by Linda and Dave Brightwell generated many compliments. A huge shout-out to all our volunteers for the event!

Spring Garden Market


May 10th-11th - Greater DSM Botanical Garden

The CIOS set up a small information booth to share orchid information with attendees shopping the Spring Market event. It included a small orchid display with plants from several club members.







May Meeting Brief

Carol Lewnau reported that she ordered 25 orchid care books, which came before the Canoyer event, but there were only 7 books in the box, which was damaged. Eventually she got more books, so we will be selling the books for \$15 to club members and \$20 to non-members.

The Treasurer's report was read and approved. We have a balance in our checking account of \$4542.49, plus the CD of \$5080.05. Chriss reported that we have lots of books that can be checked out, as well as many orchid magazines.

Canoyer 'You Can Grow Orchids" Event: 110 orchid plants were ordered from Kalapana and Fred Clarke, plus phal donated by Doc. We paid \$1819 for the plants. Sales at Canoyer's were \$2023, plus \$360 that Maria sold later, so a total of \$2323 in sales. We made \$564 profit. General comments were that customers bought "lots of plants," the re-potting and display boards were successful, the

display was very nice, and we received some positive comments on the Square reader. Now some questions were asked about whether to continue next spring, maybe in the fall also, should we stay in Grimes or try at the Ankeny location. Lots to think about.

Speaker's Day:

We have the program order set up. Carson said the Chicago judges have been invited, as well as other societies -Batavia, Kansas City, Minnesota, Eastern lowa, Omaha. Carson will send invites to previous attendees also. Maria has made a flyer with info about Speaker's Day, for handing out at the Botanical Gardens event this weekend, along with a registration slip. Brian explained the Speaker's Day schedule, beginning at 8am with continental breakfast supplied by the Club, then both speakers will give their morning talk, potluck lunch, with chicken, ham, potato salad, and baked beans supplied by the club, then 1 afternoon talk, dessert bar, second afternoon talk, and door prizes. An informative and super fun day!

Membership

The Central Iowa Orchid Society (CIOS) was organized in 1961. It is a nonprofit social club. Membership in the CIOS also includes membership in the Mid-America Orchid Congress.

Yearly dues are \$15 for an individual or \$25 for a family. New members joining after July 1st are only required to pay one-half the annual membership fee - \$7 for an individual or \$12 for a family. Membership can be renewed starting January 1st and dues become delinquent after the Februrary meeting. Members will be dropped from the roll if dues have not been paid in six months.

Meetings are generally held on the first Sunday of every month at the Union Park Methodist Church, East 12th & Guthrie, Des Moines and begin at 2:00 pm.

Among the advantages of membership in CIOS are a large library of orchid literature, programs, displays and discussions on blooming plants, helpful advice, door prizes, and friendly socializing about orchids.
